Introduction

The subject of this class is a most important one. Personally, the author has seen many instances of God's people finding themselves in difficult situations because of a lack of abundance in things of necessity. Most of the time, this lack is due to a lack of planning and work -- not doing what God instructs. This lack touches all areas of a Christian's life.

The Need for Planning and Preparation

The Six P's – Prior Proper Planning Prevents Poor Performance – is an important discipline that every believer should master. When one is prepared beforehand, he is ready for every good work. This rule applies in short-term and long-term objectives.

The apostle Paul wrote to Timothy: "If a man therefore purge himself from these, he shall be a vessel unto honour, sanctified, and meet for the master's use, and prepared unto every good work" (2 Timothy 2:21). Timothy was instructed by the apostle to put forth the due diligence (purging himself from fleshly things) so that he would be a sanctified vessel, ready for the Master's use. Timothy was to be "prepared for every good work." The opposite understanding is correct also – that if Timothy (or whoever) did not do what was needed, he would not have been prepared. Undertaking a task or going to battle unprepared is not evidence of wisdom.

I do not know how high the percentage is, but I should say it is very high (perhaps 99%), that whatever a man prepares himself for, he will very likely use it at some point in his life. For example, if a man memorizes John 3:16 in a foreign language, I expect God will allow him the opportunity to use it at some point. It may not be today or tomorrow, but I believe eventually there will be the opportunity.

And if this is the case with random things, it is even more important that the disciple prepare himself for reproduction – a commanded activity. This syllabus is a study on the New Testament *Doctrine of Reproduction*.

Our Savior Jesus Christ expects (and will judge accordingly) our faithfulness to carry out his commandments. The Lord expects his disciples to be fully committed to him in this life. We have to look forward, not back. "And Jesus said unto him, No man, having put his hand to the plough, and looking back, is fit for the kingdom of God" (Luke 9:62). Paul understood he had to "press toward the mark" – Philippians 3:12-17. Hebrews 12 says, "Looking unto Jesus."

The "long-view" is not only practical, but necessary. Jesus had this (Hebrews 12:1-3), and so should we.

The Important "Missing Link"

Dr. D. M. Fraser, who spent thirty years developing and proving the School of the Scriptures, had the lion's share of the curricula prepared and proved in about twenty years. However, he knew something was missing, so he was not fully persuaded to turn over the work saying it was complete until he added the missing piece. Finally, by prayer and study, he understood that the *reproduction* part of the work, the training, the schools, the men, the scriptures, etc.; had to be added as the last and important stage.

Regardless of how great and effective a man, a work, a system, or a school may be, if they are not reproducing the necessary elements to continue and multiply, that work will cease.

It was also through this reproduction that things were proved to be true and faithful. Once you reproduce something you can compare it to the original and judge its worthiness. Furthermore, by reproduction the overall quality and efficiency is perfected. We find the “bugs” and get them out. This works in churches, study, families, manufacturing, etc. Somehow when a thing is reproduced, we tend to see the defects more clearly (ask any parent).

As for me, I have nine children. I have told them to strive to be better than their parents and praised them for so doing. I do not want to hold them back from success so that they have no light of their own. I sincerely want them to be better parents, better Christians, know more Bible, be more faithful, love God more, have better income, live at a higher standard, have more beautiful children, etc. For the most part this has happened.

I also raised them with the instruction that “what we allow in moderation our children will do in excess.” Whether sinful, like drinking; or good, like holiness. “*A man who drinks a beer a day will have a son who drinks a six-pack a day,*” is the warning. A man who truly loves God will have a son who serves God even more.

For example, when I got saved at 25 years old, I had to learn the Bible. And by God’s grace I did. But I still have “old baggage” I wish I did not have to deal with. In respect to my four sons, they were home-schooled and taught the Bible every day. They were “rocked in a Baptist cradle.” They were hearing hymns sung while in the womb. They have heard preaching from birth.

They all got saved a lot earlier than I did. Today, all four serve God. They started serving God many years before the age that I got saved. They also were relieved of that “baggage” because of being raised in a “greenhouse.” I believe they are better Christians than I will ever be. Furthermore, from a financial position they have better income, better living standard, and they do not struggle financially as we did for twenty years of marriage. They were wise to hear their father’s instruction (Proverbs 13:1).

There are many a good man in the ministry today, and many more who have lived over the last two thousand years. If I may present a question to the student: How many of these good men, so faithful in study, labor, and love for the Lord; overlooked the need to reproduce themselves by training their replacements? Consequently, so many good works fall to the wayside after the *dynamic personality* of the founder or leader is passed from the scene.

One simply has to look at how many good churches have preacher training schools under their own church authority. Not many. It is the church that is the pillar and ground of the truth (1 Timothy 3:15). It is the church that has the responsibility to reproduce their preachers (2 Timothy 2:2). Those churches that are faithful in this one area will not lack laborers, and the students will all be like-minded in doctrine, all using the same “water” (i.e., bible, church, and men).

The Need for Labor

Besides the desire and the planning, one must put forth effort (work) in order to multiply. Whether saving money, planting the field, training disciples, or raising godly seed; there is a necessary element of work involved.

Paul mentioned he worked with his own hands so that he would not be chargeable to the Thessalonian brethren (1 Thessalonians 2:9). He later informed them this was an ensample to follow (2 Thessalonians 3:7-13). Paul told the Ephesians, “Let him that stole steal no more: but rather let him labour, working with his hands the thing which is good, that he may give to him that needeth.” (Ephesians 4:28).

Diligent labor is a good thing to learn and teach – and teach by example. And one’s labor is not in vain in the Lord (1 Corinthians 15:58).

Simply “reproducing” from a natural or casual effort will yield little of value. We must teach *faithful men, who shall be able to teach others* (2 Timothy 2:2). We are *ensamples* to the flock (1 Peter 5).

Understanding Psalm 40:8, Acts 1:1, 2 Timothy 2:2, and Philippians 4:9, we can state the seven-fold process as this:

- Look
- Listen
- Learn
- Live
- Love
- Labor
- Lead

Then we are prepared to....

- Leave

One must learn, live, and love the work before he can lead in the work. There is a lesson built on this process in this class. Men in God’s ministry should strive to have the “long view” and understand their place in history and the *chain of influence* that we have.

Once the replacements are in place, the man should *leave* – turn over the work to younger men, and just be available when asked. A man must realize that others will do things differently and maybe not as well. But if the man is God’s replacement, we should rely on that. God will give the wisdom to know when it is time to leave and go on to other things.

The Need for Building Good Foundations

Our lives as followers of Jesus Christ are likened to building projects (Matthew 7:24-29). We have a sure foundation – Jesus Christ and his word – on which to build our lives. The building of this spiritual house is our responsibility. This house should be built rightly, sturdily, and without short-cuts or sloppy workmanship. Jesus said whosoever *heareth* and *doeth* his sayings is likened to a wise man who builds on the Rock (Matthew 7:24).

Your life as a Christian has an influence on all those with whom you come in contact: your family, your relatives, your co-workers, your friends, your church, your community, etc. You should desire that your influence produces a positive, Godly impact in peoples’ lives. Being a good testimony is a necessary thing. Having a “pattern of good works” (Titus 2:7) and being “ensamples to all that believe” (1 Thessalonians

1:7) is very necessary when building your house. This is because all things will follow this pattern you have built.

You can only reproduce *what you are*. You cannot reproduce what you are not. And if you reproduce, you will reproduce what you are. A tree is known by its fruit. The apple tree bears apples, and the fig tree bears figs, and a bramble bush bears thorns. I cannot bear children of a different race. And if we want malamute puppies, we need malamute parents. The important lesson is to first be what you want to reproduce by following the eight-fold process above.

For example, if you tolerate certain weaknesses, sins, weights, or shortcomings in your life; your children, church, and others will have a tendency to copy these, thinking they are acceptable. And, unless they are confessed and forsaken, your causing a duplication of these things will be a matter of grief to you and whoever follows.

“What we allow in moderation, our children do in excess.” Little sins accepted now will grow over time. Once you give place to the devil (Ephesians 4:27) – yield territory in your life – he will continue to gain ground and increase his influence. When one sows the wind, he will reap the whirlwind (Hosea 8:7).

Whether a parent, a fellow Christian, a pastor, a church, or a teacher; we need to make sure our foundation is solid and that we are a righteous pattern for others to follow. We need to be able to say, as did our brother Paul, “Be ye followers of me, even as I also am of Christ” (1 Corinthians 11:1).

Consider your Pattern

In Exodus 25:9 we find the first use of the word *pattern*. God supplied a pattern for the making of all things related to the tabernacle. By God supplying the pattern, all that followed was correct (Hebrews 8:5).

God supplies patterns. For our life, our Pattern is Jesus Christ. At the same time we are patterns for others to follow. Paul was a pattern to follow (1 Timothy 1:16; 1 Corinthians 11:1), and he instructed Titus to be a pattern of good works (Titus 2:7).

In manufacturing – whether dressmaking, shipbuilding, sculpting, architecture, publishing, etc. – most things need to follow a pattern. From the holes on your car’s wheel to the milk jug in your refrigerator, a pattern was used for its making. Imagine if things were made “*willy-nilly*” without reproductive constraints. Our world would be chaos. We have patterns for academics – what is required to be a doctor or other professionals. We have patterns for proper building (called building codes). We have patterns for proper government – called a Constitution. And we have a pattern for living – Jesus Christ and his commandments.

The man of God should be a pattern of good works. My son Isaiah put it this way: “If you have a series of numbers such as 1, 2, 3, 1, 2, 3, 1, 2, 3, 1, 2, 3...; it is easy to know what comes next. People expect the pattern to continue, and rightly so. However, if the numbers are random (like some peoples’ lives): 8, 12, 1, 47, 22, 47, 105, 61, 77, 2, 19...; no one knows what to expect next.”

If I am in church on Sunday morning for the last 35 years, where do you expect me to be next Sunday? If I abstain from alcohol consumption every day for 35 years, do you expect me to have a cocktail next week?

People know patterns – whether reliable or unreliable. We all need to be mindful of the patterns we set. For this is the pattern that will be used for reproduction.

Be assured, unless you are a hermit, you will reproduce. And be assured, you will reproduce what you are – whether good or bad. Lastly, be assured, you should be a pattern which is worthy of reproduction.

The Need for Laborers

Our Savior told us the harvest is great and the laborers are few (Matthew 9:37, 38; Luke 10:2). As you look at ministries, businesses, schools, etc., you will see they all need laborers. God's work needs laborers. Our Savior showed us the need and gave us the remedy – pray the Lord of the harvest, that he will send forth laborers into his harvest.

But, brethren, we need to be ready, willing, and able to teach these laborers, once Jesus sends them to us.

The Need for Preparing our Replacements

The longer I am in this world the more important I see the need to prepare our replacements. What God has given us, shown us, made us; should be passed on to benefit the next generations. The skills, the understanding and wisdom, the works and responsibilities; will all be left behind. And unless each one of us purposes to pass these things to those who will receive them – *that is, faithful men* – we will find ourselves a Paul without a Timothy, or a Moses without a Joshua.

The time to prepare is *now*. Life moves so quickly. It is a vapor. One should not wait until the twilight years to start thinking about getting his affairs in order and preparing a replacement. Even as a youth one should be mindful of this preparation. Just as the earlier we start investing money for future use is wise, so it is wise to prepare our followers as early as possible.

People are always watching. People we are responsible for. Older teens have younger teens watching their behavior. Older siblings have your brothers and sisters watching and learning. Older saints have younger saints watching and learning.

It is a sad commentary if you are a pastor without a replacement, a teacher without a substitute, a master without a disciple. It is a sad commentary if you have lived on this earth for a length of time and have not influenced people in a positive way to carry on a good work. It is worse if you chose not to reproduce because you fear someone out-performing you. *I would to God all our people would out-perform me.*

There is always a Need

Regardless of your strengths and weaknesses, you have the ability to lead rightly in some areas and learn rightly in others. For example, even as a pastor, if I wanted to learn how to operate a machinist's lathe, I would have to seek out a capable machinist that knows his trade. I would have to ask him and reward him for taking the time to impart his wisdom to me. I would have to look, listen, and learn with a meek and humble spirit. To have any expertise at this work, I would have to live it, love it, and labor in it. My age has nothing to do with anything – it is purpose of heart.

I remember in 1991 when our church obtained three Multilith 1050 offset printing machines. We used these machines for years to publish tons of scriptures.

Although I had taken a course in printing at a local college a few years previously, I neither had the knowledge or understanding of these machines, nor how to rightly operate them. One can damage himself or the machine if he is not careful when using these machines.

By God's grace, the salesman I contacted for printing supplies mentioned to me he had operated these machines for decades before getting into his current work. I asked him very passionately if he would do me the kindness to show me how to operate the machines.

Although this man was not a Christian, I still remember him putting his tie in this shirt, rolling up his sleeves, and taking the two to three hours to show me how the 1050 operated and adjusted. I think I can say he enjoyed this time as much as I did (he *loved* it). Afterwards, with our hands covered in ink, I became much more able to do God's work – because this gentleman took the time to relay his knowledge to me. I cannot remember and I do not know for sure if this man ever received Jesus Christ, but I do know he was extremely helpful to our church in the printing of thousands of John and Romans booklets.

Whatever you know well, you can use for the Lord.

Limitations and Limi-“tators”

We all have talents and limitations. Limitations are things we have to accept – *“A man should accept his limitations.”* Our limitations can be due to our background, age, strength, abilities, responsibilities, culture, etc.

However, we need to understand that those who follow us will likely not have the same limitations. In fact, thankfully, they will be able to improve upon and take further the things we build. We should understand and desire this. We should not try to hold back disciples from doing greater works (John 14:12) – being a “limi-tator.” We should not impose our limitations on those who follow. People have to learn, and many learn by making mistakes, they learn by “messing up.” We must be willing to extend the grace and patience that we enjoyed (or did not enjoy) when we were being taught.

Do not limit your followers. Yes, all things must be done decently and in order, but watch your pride. Do not discourage, do not hinder, do not be a stumbling block.

I was saved at twenty-five years old, whereas my sons were saved as children. At twenty-five I began my Christian walk and have tried to be faithful in the Lord's work. Before salvation, I had no Christian example to follow. By the time my children get to age twenty-five, they should be far more knowledgeable than I am of the things of God. They have had multiple examples since birth – rocked in a Baptist cradle. I am and was limited by my background of being lost and in sin for a third of my life. They are not. They should be better preachers, better husbands, better fathers, better Christians. If they are not, I failed.

They pick-up where I leave off. They take what I built and make it better. They do greater works. They have better understanding.

Some have limitations of age. Some have limitation of ability. I think of a Christian brother I knew who had a younger brother paralyzed from the neck down. Because of his infirmity he could only read the Bible

and pray. However, we made him a very-large print New Testament to make it easier for him to read. His room was full of prayer cards, and he was faithful in praying for all he knew of. His limitation of being incapacitated also allowed him an advantage of prayer. I am sure this man could have taught me something about patience and prayer.

Moses was limited in that he could not enter the promised land, but his replacement Joshua did that work exceedingly well. The work of Moses would not have been completed without Joshua, and the work of Joshua would not have been possible without Moses. It is a two-way beneficial system.

David was not allowed to build the temple because of his bloody background, but his son Solomon did that work exceedingly well. David's vision and desire would never had been accomplished without Solomon, and without David, Solomon could not have done the work. David gathered the gold, brass, cedar, etc. for the building, and he gave his son that great vision – that this house of God would be the greatest temple second to none. This is a fine example of a mutually beneficial relationship.

Our Savior Jesus Christ was limited to three and a half years of ministry, ending with the necessity of the crucifixion and resurrection. His doctrine was given to his disciples to take to the world. Although Jesus never left the area of Israel in his day, today the world has been evangelized. Jesus accomplished the work with and through his disciples. And the disciples could never have done the work without Jesus. Jesus said, “Verily, verily, I say unto you, He that believeth on me, the works that I do shall he do also; and greater works than these shall he do; because I go unto my Father” (John 14:12).

As we develop the lessons in this syllabus, we will see more and more of this *Doctrine of Reproduction* expressed in the Bible.

The Doctrine of Scriptural Reproduction and its Connection to Love Commandment Doctrine

As with every class, we must understand the subject and its connection to the Great Commandment of Loving God and your brother

The love of God provokes us to want to be obedient, and such obedience requires reproduction. That God commanded such obedience in his word is plain to all. Additionally, because we love God and our brother, we want to see all the saints progress and develop to their fullest potential for the Lord. We want to *teach all nations* – basically reproducing ourselves – simply because we want to love our Savior. If you love me, keep my commandments (John 14:15).

- F. If during disbursement period the amount of disbursement is less than the growth, the nest egg never diminishes.
- G. Any gifts to family members (inheritances) should be given while alive to avoid inheritance taxes, probate, and other financial charges. Joint accounts can be accessed by grandparent and grandchild equally, even in case of death.
